



Mini-Book Activity:

- Take a piece of colorful printer paper and fold it in half (the long way). Cut two slits (evenly spaced apart) in the front half of the paper toward the fold. You will end up with three flaps on the front outside.



- Lay the booklet facing you with the long way lying left-to-right and the fold at the top (as in second drawing above). The flaps will lift up to open. On the front outside of the first flap, draw a left hand with the word **Christ** in the middle of the hand. On the middle flap, draw a globe (the world) with the word **is** in the middle of the globe. On the right flap, draw a right hand with the word **Creator** in the middle of the hand. (The two hands should appear as though they are holding the globe.)
- Follow the below diagram for writing the six words (**Father, Son, Spirit; Eternally One God**) and cutting and gluing the above three Bible verse “cards.”





- Take a piece of colorful printer paper and fold it in half (the short way). Cut a slit up the middle of the front half until you reach the fold mark.



- On the front outside left flap, write the word **Adam** and draw a picture representing Adam. On the front outside right flap, write the word **Christ** and draw a picture representing Christ.
- On the inside of the left and right flaps, cut and glue the "cards" labeled **Adam** and **Christ**.

The Promise of a Savior

God promised to send a Savior. He would be born of a woman. Satan would hurt the Savior (through His death on a cross), but the deathblow would not be final; His "heel would be bruised." The Savior would overcome the "bruising" through His resurrection; He would overcome death. In overcoming death, Satan would be crushed under the Savior's foot; Satan's "head would be bruised."



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Mini-Book Activity:

1. Take a piece of colorful printer paper and fold it in half (the short way). Cut two slits in the front half of the paper toward the fold. You will end up with three flaps on the front outside.
2. Draw, color, and cut out a piece of paper to look like a fig leaf. Draw, color, and cut out a piece of paper to look like a lamb's skin. Draw, color, and cut out a cross. Glue the fig leaf, the lamb's skin, and the cross, one on each of the three flaps in that order from left to right.
3. In the middle of the fig leaf, write the word **God's**. In the middle of the lamb's skin, write the word **Sin**. In the middle of the cross, write the word **Covering**.



4. Lifting each flap, cut and glue the above "cards" under the appropriate flap.

- Abel's offering looked forward to the coming sacrifice of the Lamb of God.
- God accepted Abel's offering.

- Cain's offering was from the work of his own hands (from the fruit of the ground he had tilled).
- Cain's offering reflected when we try to offer sacrifices of our own accord, of our own works.
- God rejected Cain's offering.


Seeing Christ

- When Cain killed Abel out of jealousy (jealousy that God had accepted Abel's offering but didn't accept his own), the blood of Abel cried out for atonement (Gen. 4:10). This was prophetic of Jesus' coming death on the cross, whose death provided the final atonement.

Genesis 6-9

God Saved Noah

- Noah and his family were saved by God's grace alone.
- God provided Noah and his family with an ark of safety from God's wrath.
- In the ark, there was only one door through which Noah and his family could enter to be saved from God's wrath.
- When God commanded Noah and his family to enter through the ark door, they had to urgently comply. No one else could enter once the door was closed. Those who were not on the ark of safety were forever lost.

God Saves Us

- God saves us by His grace alone.
- Jesus Christ is our ark of safety from God's wrath.
- Jesus is the only door through which we can enter God's presence and be saved from God's wrath.
- When God calls a person to enter the door through Jesus, there is urgency to do so. We do not know when our time here on earth is finished, and if we haven't already entered the door through Jesus before we die, it is too late once we die. Those who do not enter the door through Jesus before they die will forever be separated from God's presence.

Genesis 12:1-3

“Now the LORD had said to Abram:

Christ in the Promise

God promised Abraham that through him, all nations would be blessed. This spoke of the promised Savior, Who would descend through Abraham’s line. Abraham believed the promise, and his faith was accounted to him as righteousness.

While the promised Savior would descend through Abraham’s line, the promise of salvation through Christ was not just for the Jewish nation who would descend through Abraham, but was for all nations (“...in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed”). The promise of salvation through Christ for even the Gentiles was given in that blessing.

Just as Abraham believed the promise in faith and it was accounted to him as righteousness, those who believe in faith in the atoning work of Christ are deemed righteous through the blood of Christ. The real spiritual sons of Abraham are those who believe in faith God’s promise of salvation for all who trust in the atoning work of Christ.

Genesis 14:18-20

Melchizedek

- His name means "king of righteousness."
- Hebrews 7:3 says of him, "...without father, without mother, without genealogy, having neither beginning of days nor end of life, but made like the Son of God, remains a priest continually." With no descendants, there were no priests to follow him.
- He was a priest-king.
- His priesthood was outside of the Levitical priesthood.
- He was a "type" of the Great High Priest to come. Melchizedek may have been a Christophany (theophany; pre-incarnate Christ).
- Melchizedek was greater than Abraham, and his priesthood was greater than the Levitical priesthood which is traced back to Abraham. Abraham acknowledged the superiority of Melchizedek when he received Melchizedek's blessing and he tithed to Melchizedek.

Christ

- Jeremiah prophesied of the coming Messiah, "He shall be called THE LORD OUR RIGHTEOUSNESS" (Jeremiah 23:5-6)
- Being God, Jesus is eternal. As the final and Great High Priest, there are no priests to follow Him. Jesus remains the Great High Priest forever.
- He is the Great High Priest-King.
- As Jesus descended from the Tribe of Judah and not of the Tribe of Levi, His priesthood was outside of the Levitical priesthood.
- Christ's priesthood was after the order of Melchizedek.
- The Jews would have questioned on what authority Jesus is considered the Great High Priest when He descended from the Tribe of Judah and not from the Tribe of Levi. Furthermore, the Jews considered Abraham the greatest of all the Israelites. Yet, Abraham paid a tithe to and received a blessing from Melchizedek, indicating Abraham acknowledged the superiority of Melchizedek. The writer of Hebrews explained to the Jews that Jesus is the rightful Great High Priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

Genesis 16:7-13

The Angel of the LORD

"Now the Angel of the LORD found [Hagar] by a spring of water in the wilderness, by the spring on the way to Shur...Then the Angel of the LORD said to her, 'I will multiply your descendants exceedingly, so that they shall not be counted for multitude'...Then [Hagar] called the name of the LORD who spoke to her, You-Are-the-God-Who-Sees; for she said, 'Have I also here seen Him who sees me?'" Genesis 16:7-13

Hagar clearly recognized the Angel of the LORD as God. The Angel of the LORD clearly identified Himself to Hagar as God. It is obvious from Hebrews chapter 1 that Jesus Christ is so much better than the angels. After all, Jesus is not a created being, as is an angel. So, just who is this Angel of the LORD in Genesis 16 and other chapters of the Old Testament, who identifies Himself as God and is identified as God? He is none other than a Christophany, a theophany, a pre-incarnate Christ. In other words, He "...is a manifestation of God in visible and bodily form before the incarnation of Jesus Christ."

Genesis 22:1-19

Isaac and Abraham

- Isaac was miraculously born to Abraham and Sarah (they were too old to have a child, it was humanly impossible).
- God had tested Isaac's father, Abraham, by telling him to sacrifice his son, Isaac, the son through whom the promised blessing to all nations was to come. As Abraham was leading Isaac to the place where he was to be sacrificed, Isaac had to carry his own wood for the sacrifice (Gen. 22:6).
- Knowing there was to be a sacrifice, Isaac questioned his father as to the whereabouts of the sacrificial lamb. Yet, Isaac willingly let his father bind him and place him on the wood on the altar, as his father told him God would provide a sacrificial lamb in due time.
- When God saw that Abraham trusted Him even to the death of his son, He stopped Abraham from sacrificing his son and provided a substitutionary sacrificial lamb (ram) instead. The only sacrifice God accepts is the one He provides.
- When Abraham was willing to sacrifice Isaac, he showed that he believed God is able to raise people from the dead. He knew that if indeed God was going to have him follow through on sacrificing his son, Isaac, that God would raise him from the dead. After all, Isaac was the son through whom the promised blessing to all nations was to come, and Abraham knew God would follow through on that promise. He understood by faith God's eternal plan of redemption. That faith was accounted to him as righteousness.

Christ

- He was miraculously born to Mary (she was a virgin, it was humanly impossible).
- Jesus had to carry His own cross on the way to Calvary (before Simon of Cyrene bore the cross for Christ).
- Jesus asked His Father to "let this cup pass from Me, yet not My will be done but Yours." (Matthew 26:39) Jesus willingly went to the cross to be crucified.
- Jesus is our substitutionary sacrificial Lamb. He is the only sacrifice who was acceptable to the Father. He is the only One through whom we can approach the Father.
- Jesus Christ was raised from the dead. God's plan of redemption was fulfilled through Jesus Christ. When, in faith, we believe on Jesus Christ, trusting in His atoning work on the cross, we are deemed righteous through the blood of Jesus.

"Now Jacob went out from Beersheba and went toward Haran. So he came to a certain place and stayed there all night, because the sun had set. And he took one of the stones of that place and put it at his head, and he lay down in that place to sleep.

"Then he dreamed, and behold, a ladder was set up on the earth, and its top reached to heaven; and there the angels of God were ascending and descending on it. And behold, the LORD stood above it and said: 'I am the LORD God of Abraham your father and the God of Isaac; the land on which you lie I will give to you and your descendants. Also your descendants shall be the dust of the earth; you shall spread abroad to the west and the east, to the north and the south; and in you and in your seed all the families of the earth shall be blessed. Lessons Learned






- Jesus is our Rock. Jesus is our Rest. If we walk closely with the Lord, anything ~ even a stone pillow ~ becomes our resting place.
- Jesus is our only ladder into the presence of the Father. Jesus is the only One through Whom we can enter heaven.
- In Jacob's dream, the "door" to heaven remained open with angels freely descending and ascending. Heaven remains open to all who receive in faith, by the grace of God, Jesus' work on the cross at Calvary. Jesus is the ladder between earth and heaven. He is the only means through which we can enter heaven's door.

- His enemies conspired to have Him put to death (He was crucified);


- His family recognized Him after He arose from the dead;

Christ


- Jesus is the Ruler and King. Through His death and resurrection, He triumphed over Satan and death.
