<p>Bible Reading</p> <p>Read aloud 1-3 chapters (parent chooses the pace) from an official translation of the Bible. If you are teaching any young children, ALSO read aloud the equivalent account(s) in a children's book of Bible stories. If you don't have such an equivalent account, summarize chapter(s) in your own words. If you do read from a children's Bible (<u>in addition</u> to an official translation), discuss any discrepancies between the official translation and the children's version. <p>Key Scripture Penmanship Parent chooses key Scripture each day from chapters to be read. If SOW has already selected a key Scripture for the chapters you are currently reading for the day, you may use that Scripture. Student writes Scripture on white-lined notebook paper in cursive or manuscript, as appropriate. For young children, consider typing key Scripture on copy paper in gray color so the child can trace it (or type using www.Startwrite.com if you have a subscription). If lapbooking, have child write verses onto third-size pieces of white-lined paper and staple all key Scripture papers together into mini book at end of week. If using pre-typed paper in gray color or from Startwrite, cut traced papers to fit into a mini book.</p>	F	New key Scripture based on today's Bible reading.
