REVIEW DAYS	<p>Plan review days as often as you like.</p> <p>On our review days (typically each Friday), we do SOW language arts activities and play the Bible Game.</p>
Numbers 1	<p><i>Census of Israel</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Study notebook page <p><u>Question:</u> Which ancestral tribe was not to be registered in the census of those who were eligible to serve in Israel's army? Why not? (Refer to Numbers 1:47-53.)</p> <p><u>Answer:</u> The Levites were not to be registered because they were appointed to serve over the tabernacle of the testimony, all its furnishings, and everything in it. The Levites were to camp around the tabernacle of the testimony and watch over it, so no wrath would befall the Israelite community.</p>
Numbers 2	<p><i>Organization of Camps of Israel</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Study notebook page <p><u>Question:</u> What do you think might have happened if the Israelites did not do everything the LORD commanded Moses? That is, they had not camped by their banners and/or moved out the same way, each man by his clan and by his ancestral house, as the LORD had commanded them?</p> <p><u>Answer:</u> Answers may vary.</p>
Numbers 3	<p><i>Aaron's Sons and the Levites</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Study notebook page <p><u>Question:</u> What is a possible explanation for the discrepancy between the 22,000 in verse 39 and the total of 7,500 + 8,600 + 6,200 in verses 22, 28, and 34?</p> <p><u>Answer:</u> There are different ideas about this, but a very plausible explanation is, "The discrepancy is most easily explained as textual corruption in verse 28. The number of Kohathites may originally have been 8,300. 3 (Hebrew <i>sis</i>) could quite easily have been corrupted into 6 (<i>ss</i>)." Numbers 4	<p><i>Jobs Assigned to the Levite Clans</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Study notebook page <p><u>Question:</u> Why do you think God was so specific about the jobs that He assigned to the Levite clans?</p> <p><u>Answer:</u> Answers may vary.</p>

<p>Numbers 5</p>	<p><i>Jealousy Ritual</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Study notebook page <p><u>Question:</u> If you are a girl, answer this question: If you were a wife during the Old Testament time, and your husband was jealous of you, how do you think you would have felt if you had to go before the priest for the jealousy ritual?</p> <p>If you are boy, answer this question: If you were a jealous husband during the Old Testament time, but you didn't have any evidence that your wife had slept with another man, how do you think you would have felt about bringing your wife to the priest for the jealousy ritual?</p> <p><u>Answer:</u> Answers may vary.</p>
<p>Numbers 6</p>	<p><i>Nazirite Vow</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Study notebook page <p><u>Question:</u> Name three Bible characters who were either definitely or most likely Nazirites. (Hint: Go to Judges 13:5, 7 & 24; I Samuel 1:11 & 20; Luke 1:15 & 63.)</p> <p><u>Answer:</u> Samson, Samuel, John the Baptist</p>
<p>Numbers 7</p>	<p><i>Offerings of the Leaders of Israel</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Study notebook page <p><u>Question:</u> When Moses entered the tent of meeting to speak to the LORD, and God spoke to Moses, from where did God's voice speak? (Hint: v. 89) What are some ways God speaks to us today? Have you ever "heard" God speak to you? Share your experience. What is one way to know if the voice you are "hearing" is <u>not</u> from God?</p> <p><u>Answer:</u> God's voice spoke to Moses from above the mercy seat that was on the ark of the testimony, from between the two cherubim. Today, God speaks to us through Scripture, through our conscience, through our hearts, and through wisdom shared with us by other people (especially other Christians). You can know for sure if the "voice" you are hearing is not from God if that "voice" tells you something that goes against Scripture. God's Word is true, and God will never go against His Word.</p>
